Hello Charles,

I sent pictures of flood and water intrusion to you of our home for 625 Jackson Way, Longboat Key, FL; however, wanted to include responses to the questions below. I've also reattached pictures. Thank you. Sylvia Lee & Tim Jones

1. How deep was the water in your house?

No water in the house because of the flood gates we installed and sandbags. If we didn't invest in these flood gates, we would have had easily about 1 foot plus of water in our house. The water was just flowing directly out of the Bayou (essentially, our home was in the bayou).

2. How deep was it in your garage?

Approximately 1 inch - it would have been significantly more if we didn't deploy the flood gates and sand bags.

3. How long was water over the road in front of your driveway?

It was approximately 1.5 feet but spanned the entire roadway - All of Jackson Way and Longboat Drive South.

4. If you used sandbags or a flood barrier, and water did not enter the house, how high was the water above the level of your floors?

Approximately 1.5 feet

5. If water did not enter the house or garage, how close did it get, and how deep was it in the yard at the deepest point?

The water reached the front of the house (right up to the front door and garages). If we didn't have the flood gates and sand bags deployed, we would have had significant water intrusion.

The Bayou across the street flooded the road. Additionally, drains were not cleared prior to the storm and are even worse now after the storm. These should be regularly cleared of debris; especially when there is a TS or Hurricane on the horizon.

There was about 18 inches of water in the street.

The water crept up our driveway and ultimately into our first level. There was about 5 inches of water intrusion.

Please note, when we get afternoon thunderstorms, roads quickly get flooded. There seems to be a huge issue with proper drainage.
