Re: Government Claims Submissions

Dear Lisa Saltzburg :

We have reviewed and evaluated the request for reimbursement of certain alleged losses filed by your firm on behalf of the government entities listed on the attached Schedule A.

The referenced claims are governed by the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 ("OPA") (33 U.S.C. § 2701 *et seq.*), which provides for the recovery of certain categories of damages that were caused by the injury to or destruction of a natural resource impacting these claimants. BP has determined that the referenced claims are not compensable under the terms of the OPA, specifically Section 2702(b).¹ Oil from the Deepwater Horizon Incident did not impact the referenced claimants or cause injury to or destruction of a natural resource in an area close in proximity to the referenced claimants. As a result, the claimed losses are not the result of the oil spill. Accordingly, claims submitted on behalf of the government entities listed on the attached Schedule A are denied.
